NHS MEDICAL POLICY

Ocular, Auricular and Facial Prostheses DME 2015-004

An ocular, auricular or facial prosthesis, or a prosthesis adjustment, may be indicated when any ONE of the following is present:

1	The eye has been enucleated (whole eye surgically removed).
2	The eye has been eviscerated (eye contents surgically removed).
3	The eye has phthisis bulbi (shrinking, deteriorating, non-functional eye).
4	There is congenital anophthalmia (absent eye) or congenital microophthalmia (small eye).
5	There is congenital or acquired microtia (small or absent ear).
6	There is a congenital or acquired defect of the face, orbit, ear or nose.
7	A need for polishing or re-surfacing of the prosthesis is described.
8	A need for replacing, resizing or adjusting the prosthesis is described.
