Pterygium Excision Procedure 2015-001

A pterygium is a triangular wedge of fibrovascular conjunctival tissue that typically starts medially on the nasal conjunctiva and extends laterally onto the cornea. Pterygium Excision may be indicated when ONE of the following is present:

- The provider has documented opacity in the visual axis with the pterygium measured 1 mm or more onto the cornea.
- 2 The provider has documented ALL the following:
 - Artificial tears eye drops, or another ocular lubricant has been tried and failed.
 - Treatment with a second line topical agent (e.g., topical decongestants, NSAIDs or glucocorticoids) has been tried and has failed. OR the provider has documented that this type of medical treatment is not tolerated or is contraindicated.
 - The procedure is not being considered solely for cosmetic reasons.
 - One of these indications for surgical excision of the pterygium is present:
 - ✓ Intractable irritation or pain
 - ✓ Induced astigmatism causing visual impairment.
 - ✓ Restriction of eve movement
 - ✓ Documented growth threatens to affect the visual axis via astigmatism or opacity.
