Dental Anesthesia Procedure 2018-006

General anesthesia in a hospital or surgery center may be indicated for a dental procedure when any ONE of the following is present:

A child, age 4 or under, requires treatment in more than one quadrant of the mouth which cannot be delayed until the child matures.

A child, age 8 or under, requires multiple restorations or extractions in more than one quadrant of the mouth and has a history of failed attempts in the office under local anesthesia. The dental procedures cannot be delayed until the child matures.

A dentist has described how local anesthesia would be ineffective or poorly tolerated because of acute infection, anatomic variation, or allergy to local agents.

A dentist has described how extensive dental restorative or surgical treatment cannot be adequately rendered under local anesthesia or conscious sedation.

Both local anesthesia and conscious sedation (either inhalation or oral) were already tried but failed to control pain with a needed dental procedure.

A dentist has described how a physical, intellectual, developmental, psychiatric or medical condition prevents humane and successful dental treatment under local anesthesia.
